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Confession

All: Merciful God, we humbly confess that misunderstandings and wrong doings, matched with an unwillingness to forgive, have mired us down and weakened our witness. We are more conformed to the world than we like to admit, Often looking to violence or power plays to settle our disputes. We are reluctant to let go of our “right-ness”, grudges and prejudice. Teach us, oh Savior, to yield our lives to you, to seek the welfare of others, and to trust the mysterious power of love, humility, and weakness. By your grace, help us to love you, to love ourselves, and also our neighbors. (silent prayer)

Litany for Communion

Leader: Jesus said, “I am the bread of life. Whoever comes to me will never be hungry, and whoever believes in me will never be thirsty.” (John 6: 35)
This broken bread is a symbol of Jesus’ voluntary self-giving of his life for us.

We give you thanks, O Divine Nourishment,
for the bread of life made known to us through your son Jesus.
As we gather at the table of remembrance
we receive the bread from a brother or sister and we say:

ALL: Amen. Let your will be done in us.

Leader: Jesus also took the cup, and said, “This cup is the new covenant in my blood. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me. For as often as you eat this bread and drink this cup, you proclaim the Lord’s death until he comes.” (1 Cor. 11: 25-26)

We give you thanks, O Divine Refreshment,
for the holy vine made known to us through your servant Jesus.
As we gather at the table of discipleship
we receive a cup from a brother or sister and we say:

All: Amen. Let your will be done in us.

Leader: In gratitude for all that we have received, we pray that you would renew our sense of oneness with all followers of Jesus. Where there are rifts and barriers, we pray for grace and understanding. Send your Holy Spirit among us and bring the light of your Word to instruct, heal, and inspire.

All: May this communion be ours to enact with all followers of Christ in the worldwide Church. Fill us, Jesus, with your Spirit, and with your joy. Make us one body, one light, one united witness, to the glory of your Name we ask it. Amen.

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
